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RYE NATIONALS UPDATE (From Ken Hackett)

- 1. Planning is at an advanced stage with very experienced and enthusiastic yacht club committee.
- 2. RLs will race by themselves on Wednesday, Jan. 5th (Invitation race) and on Saturday, Jan. 8th. (Long Distance race.) All other heats will be on the course with TS16s with RLs starting 5 minutes ahead.
- 3. There will be four support boats on the water covering the duties of Committee Boat, Course Laying, Start Line (leeward end) and Lead Boat. All boats will share rescue duties as required.
- 4. We are invited to provide Observers/Time Keeping Assistants for either the Committee Boat or Race Control Centre. Anyone interested in being in the thick of the action in this way, please see Ken or Ross.
- 5. Several options are likely for launching, mooring and trailer parking. All ramps are busy in January but the area is well served with a triple ramp at Rye, and ramps at nearby Tootgarook and Tyrone (refer Melways 168/169.) The Club will provide limited "over the sand" launching with a tractor but with up to 30 Hartleys sharing facilities, this is likely to be slow. Trailer parking will be available near the Club but bear in mind that summer holiday crowds may limit access. It is also possible that RL campers may be able to poke a trailer in near their tents. Overnight boat mooring/storage is possible in the shallows at waters edge. (Two good anchors recommended.) The Club will provide a security patrol in the clubhouse area or an alternative boat park may be in front of the tent area.
- 6. Camping. The camp ranger, Gordon Sheppard, has been most cooperative and is keen to see the visiting sailors are looked after. He is hoping to open up an area not usually for camping and have all the yachties together. If this arrangement comes off, it is about 400m. west of the Club but has the advantage that boats at the waters edge are in clear view of the camp.
- 7. Social. To get the ball rolling, the Club will host a Welcome Barbeque after our Invitation Race on Wednesday 5th Jan. Likely cost is about \$10. A vegetarian alternative will be available. BYO drinks or purchase your liquid requirements at the Club bar. On Saturday evening. Jan. 8th, we will have our own Social Night which will be pizzas at the Club. This will follow our AGM and will be AT NO CHARGE for RL crews and supporters. The RYC Social Committee will provide rolls/sandwiches for lunches orders to be lodged in advance. There are 2 barbeques at the Club, freely available at any time.

VICTORIAN RL24 CHAMPIONSHIPS 2000

Not yet finally confirmed but it seems highly probable that the Victorian RL24 State Titles for 2000 will be on Port Phillip Bay at Mordialloc over the weekend of March $18^{th} \& 19^{th}$. This will be in conjunction with the VYC Victorian Trailable Yacht

Championship. The host organisation, "Mordialloc Motor Yacht Club has been around for a long time but is now emerging as a pre-eminent player in the Trailable Yacht scene. The Club is going to a great deal of trouble to stage a series that trailables will find easy to get to, launch and moor. The club house is on The Island in Mordialloc Creek with excellent launching into the sheltered waters of the Creek at the mouth near the pier. Mooring pens will be available. Full details and the Race Programme will be in the Notice of Race to be posted with the next RL Newsletter in January 2000.
