RL24 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS 2006

As directed at the last AGM, your Hon. Secretary, Paul Corben, approached the Committee of the Gippsland Lakes Yacht Club Inc. for their co-operation in hosting our next National Championship regatta. Paul now reports that the Club has agreed to do this during the period 27th December 2005 to 31st December 2005. Our initial preference, you will recall, was for dates early in the New Year but the Club has a prior longstanding commitment for that period with the Flying Dutchman Association. Given that both the Dutchmen and ourselves would prefer to have exclusive use of the track, we have opted to take the earlier week for our series and declare the winners National Champions for the year 2006. One unexpected bonus of this arrangement is that our Presentation Night will coincide with the Paynesville New Years Eve Spectacular which the town sponsors every year. Association President, Bernie Ryan is again coordinating the regatta and if it is anything like as good as our last Championship, it will be another great event. Already, action is in hand to make overnight parking space available within the GLYC grounds for all competing RL's should visiting skippers require it. As we go to press, the Notice of Race is in the hands of GLYC and Yachting Victoria for their collective approval and as soon as it is cleared, it will be forwarded to all members. At this stage, the programme for all Divisions (ie Swing Keel, Drop Keel and Cruising) will look something like this:

Tuesday 27th Dec. Invitation Race – probably 2 or 3 back to back 1 lap screamers in the afternoon.

Wednesday 28th Dec Heats 1 & 2 back to back in the afternoon.

Thursday 29th Dec Heats 3 & 4 back to back in the afternoon.

Friday 30th Dec Heats 5 & 6 back to back in the afternoon.

Saturday 31st Dec Heat 7 in the morning.

All divisions will start and sail the same course simultaneously. Resails will be scheduled in the mornings if required. A comprehensive social programme is also being planned.

RL24 Victorian State Championships 2005.

The Colac Yacht Club is holding its annual regatta on the weekend of the 3rd and 4th December next and we have been invited to participate on the basis that the programme of races will constitute our State Championship series for 2005. As is well known, Colac YC is home to several notable RL24s and their more notable owners so a big fleet and a great weekend is assured. The Notice of Race is enclosed so mark the weekend in your diary now.

National Championships 2005.

Despite an appalling lack of cooperation from the weather Gods, the National Championship series held at Gippsland Lakes yacht Club, Paynesville from January to January 2005 was one of the best yet for a number of reasons. To begin with, we were favoured by the attendance for the entire week of the man responsible for the very existence of our Class, Robb Legg and his wonderfully tolerant (at least where sailing and boats are concerned!) and charming wife, Dawn. It was a great pleasure to have them involved and many members expressed the view, in one way or another, that it was very reassuring to note the extent to which the Class designer, Patron and Life Member is so obviously still nurturing the Class in his own unique style. We are indeed fortunate to have the benefit of Robb's continuing support.

Then there was the organization. This was the first time we were the beneficiaries of substantial sponsorship. Association President Jeff Germaine (Running Late) did wonderful work with his employer, GEO, to secure a very generous cash grant which was used to help defray traveling costs and administrative expenses for which the Association was very grateful. Bernie Ryan (Monkey See Monkey Do) did his bit by squeezing a useful trophy or cash out of most of Paynesville's business community and Michael Reid (Sasha) tossed in several bottles of his superb Auldstone Wineries' Muscat. Presentation Night was metaphorically an embarrassment of riches and no one left empty handed.

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Perhaps the most significant aspect of the series was that, at last, the Olde Order changeth. As alluded to above, the weather was dreadful with either far too much wind or not enough. In the end the series was decided on the basis of 5 heats, it proving impossible to make a start in two resails. None the less, the racing in both divisions was hard fought and close with results often being decided on the last work. Both division winners won 3 heats but were closely pushed throughout the series by at least two or three other competitors. So, as you will see from the attached results, the Association has a new pair of Champions and warmest congratulations are due to Bernie Ryan who won the Swing Keel Division with *Monkey See Monkey Do* and Craig Rainey, who with *Wings* won the Drop Keel Division. For Craig, this is his second RL24 National Championship, the first coming at Lake Wellington in 1989 after a series many believe was the most demanding ever held.

The series also attracted 2 new competitors in Simon O'Leary (*Miles To Go*) and Darren Dyer (*Whatever*). Darren is only "new" in the sense that this was the first RL24 Titles in which he sailed his *own* boat – last year he skippered Doug Laity's immaculate *Streaker* to a 3rd in the Swing keel Divn. Previously he sailed for many years as crew on brother-in-law Simon Walsh's *Ohau Rua*. Simon O'Leary missed the first couple of heats but he had good reason – he had been crewing in the Sydney – Hobart and was making his way back from Tasmania. The Association welcomes Simon and Darren and hopes they enjoy the RL experience for many years to come.

The Toad

This year, the Toad Trophy, perhaps the most coveted of all RL24 awards, was won by by Simon Walsh and *Ohau Rua*. Simon's bid for Toad glory was made early in the series when, at the last mark in Heat 2, he headed off for shores unknown when he should have been dashing for the finish line instead. At the time, he was in a situation not unfamiliar to him - i.e.- he was leading the field but such was the intensity of the racing that before he could correct his mistake, he'd surrendered 4 places and finished 5th. Simon was, of course, strongly challenged for the Toad, the best effort coming from last years' winner, James Shannon (*Warrigal*) James was doing well in the early heats so it was surprising to see him begin the trek out to the course in race 4 only to turn back due to what he interpreted to be a rising gale. The rest of the fleet headed out for a start as scheduled but the race was postponed due to a lack of wind! At least James had his boat back on the trailer first.
